Main Quantitative Results Presented as Graphs from Safeguarding Training for Centre Directors at Young Africa HUB

Introduction

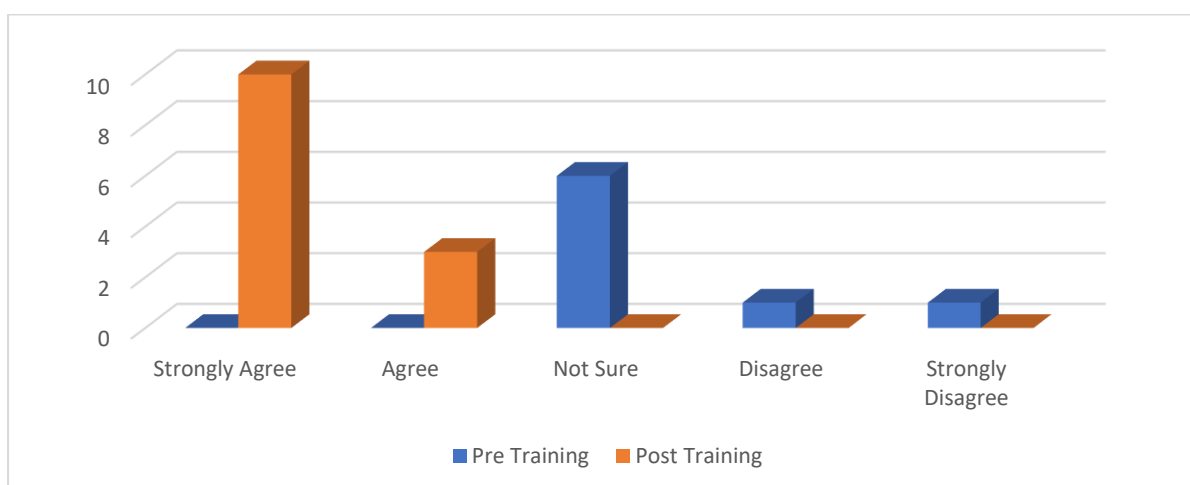
This document presents the main quantitative results of the Safeguarding Training for Centre Directors at Young Africa HUB which took place in May 2017 – a total of 12 YA staff members participated. The information is taken from the External Evaluation of the Programme (attached to final report) and is presented in graphical format.

The training content included: (A) An overview of Safeguarding including defining safeguarding, understanding its importance, legal contexts, policy responses and standards; (B) Types of abuse were discussed; (C) Key components of a Safeguarding Policy including reporting procedures and ways of enduring children and community’s voices are heard.

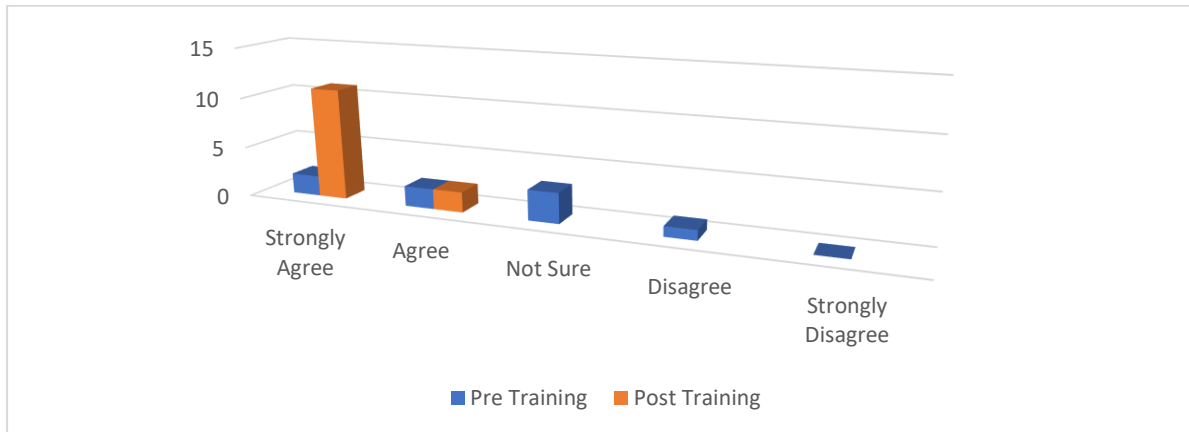
There is a clear trend within the specific questions, and when combining all responses, towards “Strongly Agree” and “Agree” which are indicators of the training having a positive impact for participants.

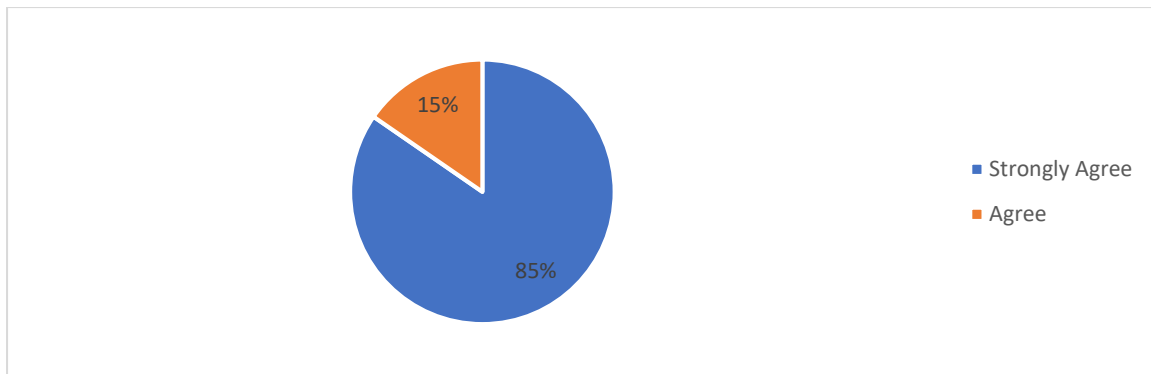
A. I understand the differences between keeping children safe within an organisation and child protection programme work



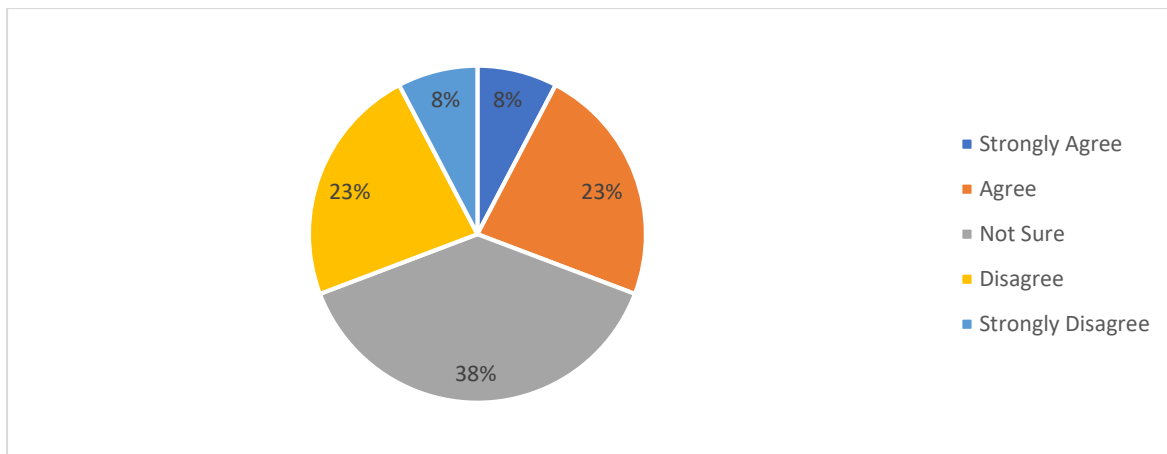
B. I understand why Child Protection is important for my work



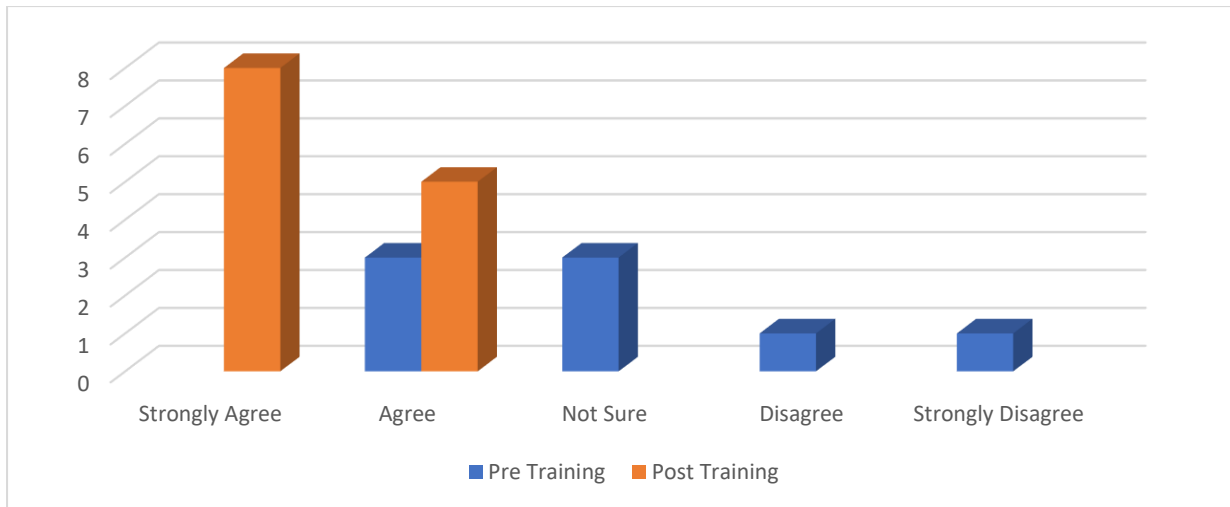
C. I understand my responsibilities in relation to child safeguarding (Post Training Only)



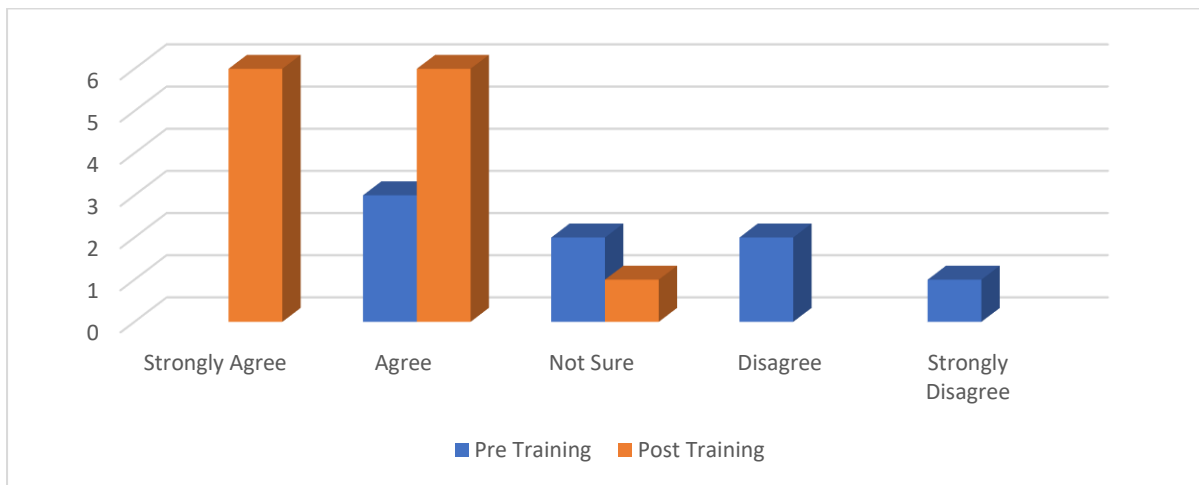
D. I understand the procedures used by Young Africa to handle safeguarding concerns/allegations (Post Training only)



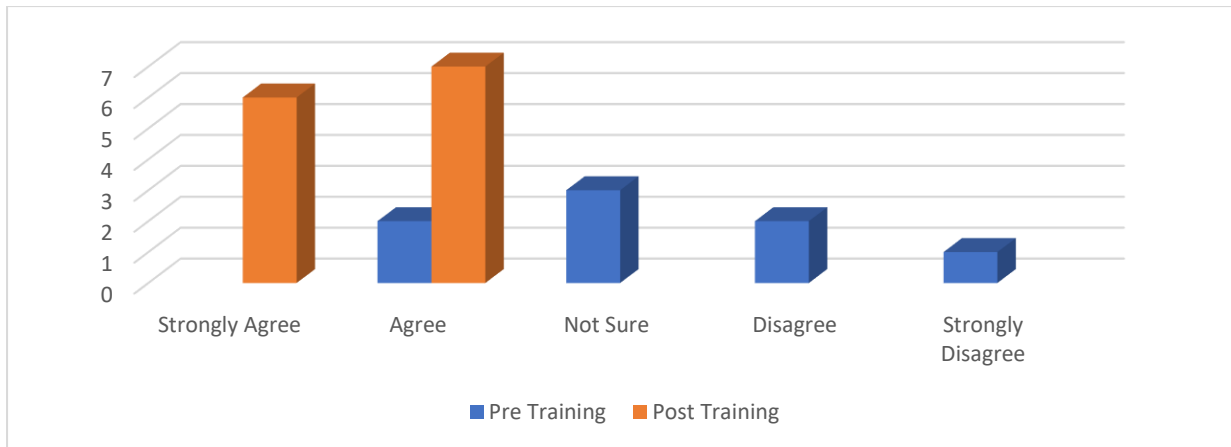
E. I feel confident communicating the importance and substance of child safeguarding to others in my organisation



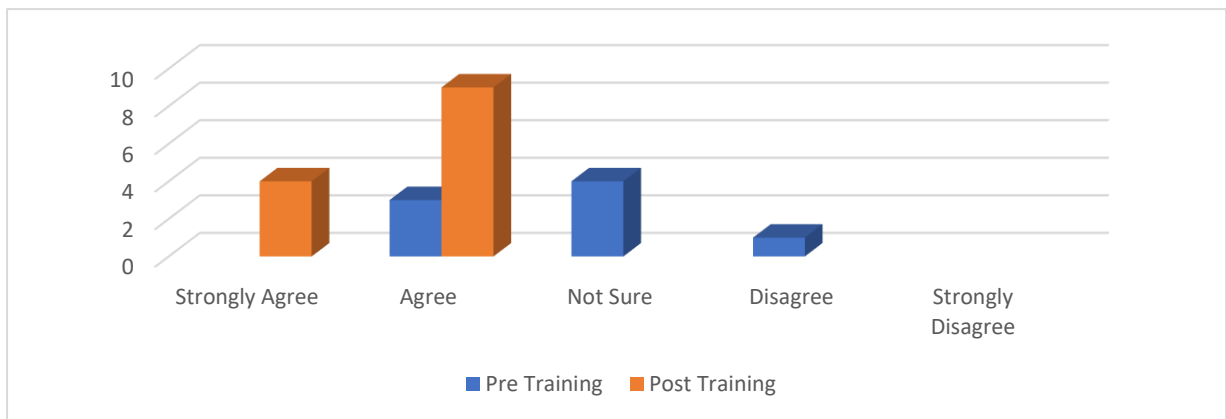
F. I feel confident communicating the importance and substance of safeguarding to members of the community



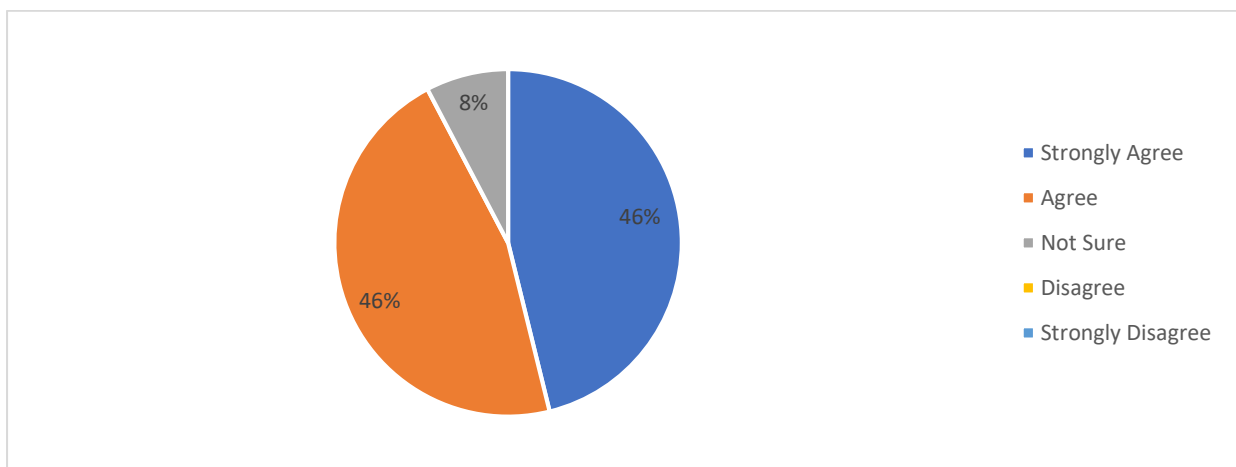
G. I feel confident facilitating discussions and activities on child safeguarding directly with children



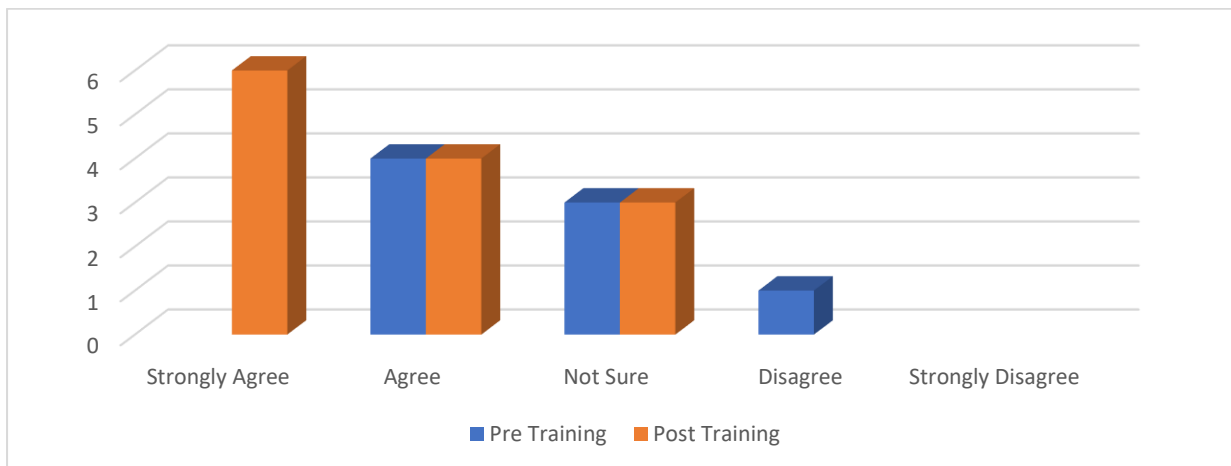
H. I feel confident to tackle culturally sensitive issues around child safeguarding whilst delivering training to others



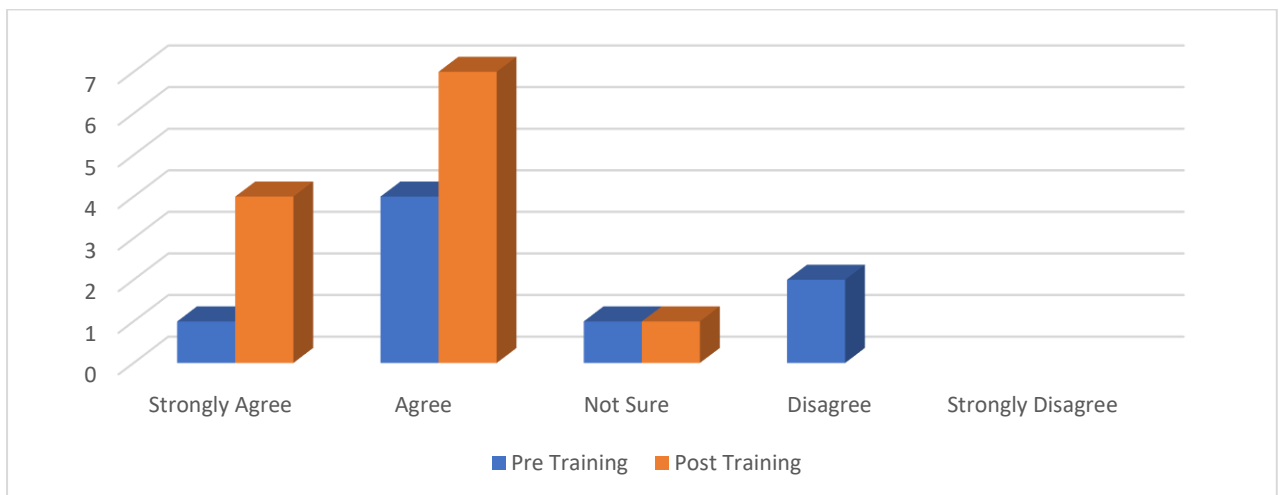
I. I feel confident to apply my learning to real life situations (Post Training Only)



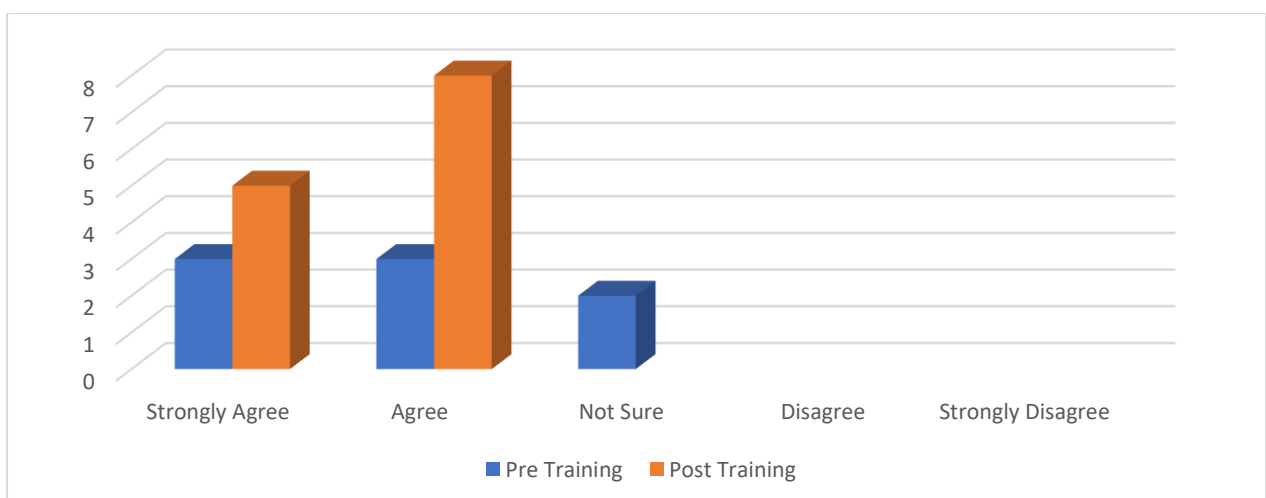
J. I feel confident in my ability to recognise potential indicators of child abuse



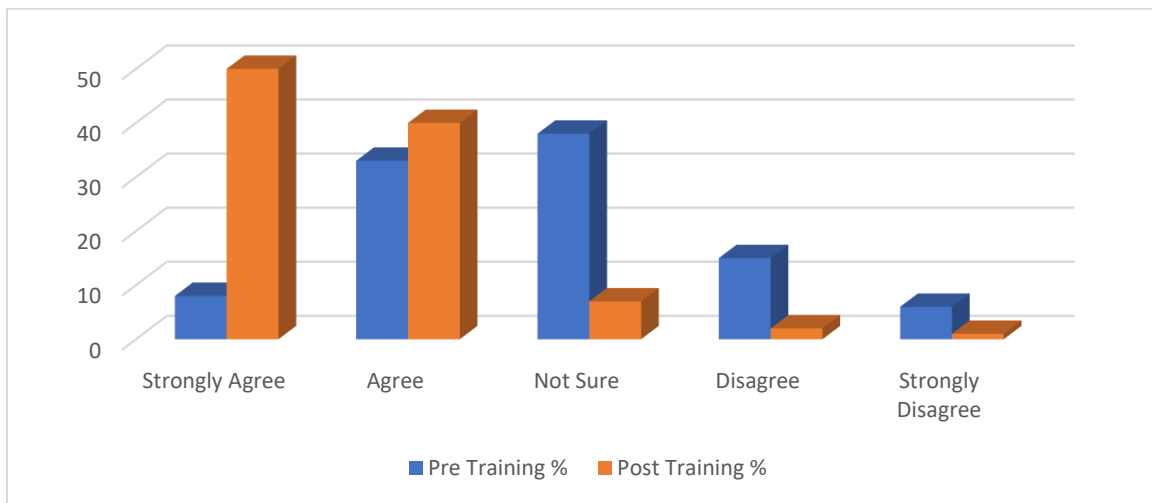
K. I understand what to do if a child discloses abuse to me or a staff member
